



Cool Indie/Punk band from Buffalo (NY, USA). Recently LEMURIA released split "7 w/OFF WITH THEIR HEAD. LEMURIA recorded for this split the PIXIES-cover "Alec Effel". Answers to questions; Alex-drummer.

1. Be presented, please - who is who in the group, and tell, how have you got acquainted with each other? Has the group appeared at once or were you familiar with each other long before when you have decided to form Lemuria? Did you play in other groups before Lemuria? Do you participate in other projects?

I'm Alex and I play drums and vocals, Sheena plays Guitar and vocals, and Jason plays the bass. Sheena and I have known eachother since We actually used to date late high school. during that time, but then we became best friends and eventually started Lemuria. Jason and I had known eachother through other friends and had a different band called Still III at the time and we had asked him to play bass with us. Still III was more of a hardcore band along the lines of Chain of Strength and Los Crudos, and Lemuria was a completely different style and much of a different approach to music. Sheena had played in a hardcore band before Lemuria called Splag, along with an acoustic project called Team Chocolate with a guy who plays in Jason's other band The Failures' Union. It's very intertwined, haha.

2. What are the other interests in your life except the group? Do you work, study? Or do you earn money only playing music?

Sheena is currently applying to go to school for baking pasteries, she's currently a waitress at my favorite diner here in Buffalo, New York. It's called Amy's Place. I run a record label called Art of the Underground, and that takes up most of my free time. Jason has a screen printing company called Wooden T-shirts. He prints our t-shirts, along with a lot of other bands and companies things. We like food a lot though. When we're on tour we love to search out delicious vegetarian restaurants. That is our biggest common interest.

3. How long did you have to rehearse to begin your concert activity? Did you compose a material for a long time? What is the first soug you've made together, and what was it about? What do you like more: playing live concerts or working in a studio?

I'm not sure what I enjoy more. I think I like playing live more. Although, I love the studio because I know I'm creating something that I will be able to keep for the rest of my life.



4. How do you spend a free time? Do you prefer spend it together or separated? What are your favorite places in Buffalo or in the country where you like to spend a free time most of all? Will you advise any clubs where it is possible to have a good time (in case I visit this city)?

Do you visit gigs of other bands just like spectators? What was the last gig you visited, and which one would you like to visit in future?

I personally love Fleetwood Mac, Tusk-era. A lot of people don't give this band credit because they just focus on their wimpy hits. Even though I also like the wimpy hits, haha. Mutually, I think we are all influenced by Leatherface, The Lemonheads, Superchunk, and Husker Du.





of my biggest influences is Screeching Weasel, they were one of my favorite bands growing up and now we're label mates with them, so that's pretty exciting for me! When I'm home in Buffalo, I go to a few concerts a week, especially because my friends bands are constantly touring through Buffalo.

We meet a lot of musicians on tour, so it's great to see them when they stroll through our hometown. Sometimes I set up the shows for them as well. I've seen a handful of bands this week, some big bands, and some smaller ones including Dinosaur Jr., Screaming Females, Marnie Stern, All of them Witches (local), Plates (local), and Co-workers (local).

6. A question about tattoos! It is visible in photos from the website that Sheena has a tattoo of a five-pointed star on her breast. And Jason has got an anchor on his shoulder. Does any one of the group members have any other tattoos? What are these tattoos for you? Is it just a decoration or do you put any sense in it?

7. Now I would like to talk about your latest album - "Get better". It seemed to me you've got no sad songs at all and the disk name is very positive, vital! Does it happen that you feel blue? How do you struggle with grief? Can you give any advices from Lemuria how to cheer up?

"Get Better" is our only full length album, we have another called "First Collection" but we don't consider that an album. It's more of a compilation of older 7" releases and random tracks.



lot of the songs originate on a sad topic, but are viewed and performed optimistically. A lot of the song topics are about my fathers death, which many of the songs were written shortly after. But I think the song tones reflect that people need to look on the bright side and keep moving on. The album title means many things, it matches the mood of the album that we're trying to convey, but also on a more focused point to myself, it directly came from a habit that I have. I often write "get better" on my drum sticks and drum heads so that when I sit down and practice I'll think to not just work on things that I'm already confident with, but also work on things that make me uncomfortable and that I know I'll have to struggle to succeed with. We thought that if we named our first album "Get We would love to come and play music in Russia Better" we would constantly see that and strive to always work harder and get better at our craft.

What is the most favorite song on "Get 8. Better" for each of you? My favorite is "Lipstick". However, I'm not sure I understand it correctly my English is quite weak. It seemed to me very unusual that Alex is the author of the song (and if I have truly understood all - the narration goes on behalf of the man), while Sheena executes its. Alex, could you tell me, how this song appeared? Does it concern any particular person and does it have anything in common with real events from your life?


pacchages war nonvenace of The song is about games that people play with emotions, the risks you take in a relationship when all you're left with is to assume , and also signals that don't have any direction.

One more question. It seemed to me that you absolutely have not songs concerning any political problems. I do not consider it as negative feature, it is all positive! But, for example, there are a lot of people in Russian socalled DIY-community who are sure it's not that right to stay aside, and ignore groups which do not talk politics. What do you think of it? Does it happen you to listen similar reproaches in your address?

When Lemuria first started, all of us were playing in other hardcore bands which we expressed our anger with political topics. The tempo and the album, depending on how you look at it. I think a mood to those bands were just more appropriate for political topics. Lemuria was started so that we could express our more emotional topics. A lot of people neglect bands who sing about their more personal feelings and songs about love. I don't really understand that mentality because when we fight for our political beliefs, ultimately we're trying to better our lives and everybody elses lives around us so that we can cherish the greater things in our lives such as love and friendships. I think political and love songs are equally important.

I guess that's all I wanted to ask you! Thanks for answers and dialogue! I'm glad I got acquainted with you and I'm waiting for your new records! May be there is anything you would like to tell the readers of the zine?

Karma Jawless is a bunch of friends who really enjoy grindcore and like to express themselves through this form of noise-music. Band name does not actually have some exact meaning. It's just a good sounding name with the dark feeling about it. The name has its history, so does the band but it's really not that interesting. To put it short - it was born like a dark fastcore/hc/sludge project, but it went out more extreme than it was expected. Karma Jawless had a few line up changes, but it is also not so important, because we all are friends and all the line-up changes were natural, caused by circumstances only. Now there are four members in the band, me on vocals, Girius on Bass, Danys on drums and Izmarel on guitar. All of us had some small musical experience before Karma Jawless, but for now this band is the main project for us. Well it sure is for me! And yes, we do participate in various other projects. Almost all of them are also in extreme tradition - noise, dark ambient, shitcore and so on. I don't feel like naming 'em right now. Maybe other members of the band want to? :) Discography and download links can found at our myspace www.myspace.com/karmajawless and we now planning to release a new album ourselves which will contain the material we recorded in few years. Fucking noisy gore grind human soup! Also the split with a band from Sweden - Facial Abuse was planned, but the label made a big delay on this one, so we still don't know how this is going to end. Some songs have no lyrics at all, just pointless shrieks and gargles coming from my throat. I consider this also as some sort of position.

Our lyrics are mostly in Lithuanian, so you wouldn't understand them but I assure you, you wouldn't find many nice words in it.

4. Blood on your myspace photos - is it real? Do You think out beforehead what to do at a show, or all occurs spontaneously? What else do you do at the concerts: Sacrifice virgins? Devour Christian babies? Throw excrements to the crowd?

No, the blood is paint, but I do not reject the possibility to try some real stuff in future. My space banned some of our pictures, because they were "too violent". That's funny, since I never knew that paint is violent. Mostly of the "show" tricks just happen on stage, when we play drunk and want to do something stupid. Some of it (like blood-paint) are prepared before the shows. By the five years at this band exists, we have done many stupid things, and pissed off a lot of stupid people. So now when people come to our shows, they know that they should expect to experience something offensive or retarded, etc.

G. Show stuff began at our early concerts spontaneously. One time Kiras was being electrified from the microphone all the time while he was singing. He got really pissed, got drunk right on the stage and took his pants off. That was the start as I recall. Mostly this stuff happens on the spot after a few beers.

D. A lot of stuff had happened over the years. Puking, fighting and dressing up in costumes. We are having fun basically, without caring what the others would think. Gasps and wide-eyes are a usual sight at our shows. The funniest thing is that we are what we are on stage, we don't wear our band t-shirts or try to look serious like grind gods. We are just that way, simple.

I don't know for the rest but I get a lot of kicks out of playing naked and little girls staring at my dick.

6. What do your parents think about Karma Jawless? Have they listen to your music?

Cour parents support what we do. I think they are happy to see that we spend some time on what we really like, doesn't matter that for them it is just wall of fucked up noise. I am really proud of my mother that she let's me do what I want and supports me all along! Yes, she heard some of our stuff, but I don't think she really knew what to say haha.

They have a basic idea, never heard any of our stuff though. I just tell them it's "metal". I think it makes them happy that we aren't stealing car stereos or doing drugs in the street. That is why I'm proud of what we do, all the way from our early teens.



Hi! What instruments do you play and how did you meet each other? Do you think it's destiny, or did you plan to play the music that Silards plays now?


Hi! There are three of us in our group. I play the keyboard, Andris plays the guitar, and Yanchik is the drummer. It all began when I had bought an old electro-organ, thought up a couple of simple melodies and called Yabchik to form a group. We had a few band practices together and then invited Andris. So, we didn't really plan it.

Where did you get your group's name?

Silards is some dude's name. About 5 years ago on 4th of June he climbed the Vantovyi Bridge across the river Daugava in Riga and demanded 2 éclairs and mineral water. Now he is in a lunatic asylum. It happened when he just left prison and it was like a protest, against the shit with which people are usually faced with when they leave prison, they can't find work, etc.

I associate your music with the 80s. Were you around back then? What do you remember from those years? And if you had the opportunity to live in another century or decade, what epoch would you choose?


I was just thinking about that. I would probably live in the 90s again, though it sucked here then. I have a kind of pop-punk



sounds like the music of the 1980s, Who knows why Silards has a particular sound; I don't know. If we're talking about the 80s, I remember a little bit about that time, waiting in line in department stores, vending machines on the street with carbonated water, "Zhiguli" and stuff like that. I have good memories. All my childhood memories are good.

When comparing your music to others, I think of The Cure and Nik Cave for some reason. What do you think about them? Who in general, in your opinion, influenced your music and what current groups are similar to your group in spirit?

Nik Cave rules! Some of us also like The Cure. At any ,rate we can all sing together Boys Don't Cry. But I don't think that they influenced directly what we play. It is strange.



dude from a French pop-punk group which played in Riga told me he thought that we play New Wave. And then another local music critic wrote that SILARDS is a mix of early post-rock and krautrock. I read it and thought: 'what the fuck is krautrock???.' And to tell the truth, fuck if I know who has influenced us. We just play a very simple music with simple melodies; it just all comes out when we play together.

One more association is the Soviet group Zodiac. They are also from Latvia. Did you heal their records? And, by the way, what about records? You also release Yekabs records on your label Prestiite. Do you sell a lot of them? Would you like to release Silards on vinyl and do you have such an opportunity?

I remember "Zodiac" by their record covers. I didn't listen to them a lot, I will have to, though. TESA records sell very well in Western Europe! Vinyl is fashionable now. A revival, you know. We thought to release Silards seven inches, but somehow it didn't happen; we released it on CDR.

When I listened to your records the first time, I thought that it would be an excellent music for film. Have you written soundtracks? And if you could, in which film you would like for your music to be played?

We seldom write songs, what soundtracks are you talking about? Though last week one of our friends told us that he wanted to put our songs in a new film. There are two dudes floating in a boat in a one small river in Riga. It was even more of a trench than a small river. And I also wanted to cover that song from Twin Peaks. I also thought that it would be appropriate if we played at a concert where, you know, there were some fashionable things on the screen during the performance, like a video from any romantic comedy with Julia Roberts and Richard Gere.

The information about your group is very brief in your disk, just where and when the tracks were recorded, and there aren't even names of the compositions. Do your tracks have names, maybe working names, to distinguish them somehow? And there are no words or vocals in your music either. Why?

Working names are too stupid to write on the album cover, like "new," "really new," "the one where Andris begins," "the where Yanchik begins," "rip-off of Tesa," etc. Next time there will be names, if we don't finish the CDs the day before we leave for tour again. All of us want to sing a little bit, but we are too lazy. And we don't want to have a vocalist. We like that there are three of us.

Your music is good to dance to. Do people dance at your concerts? And do you like to dance? Do you go to nightclubs?



Sometimes it we play out too often! We probably played more concerts abroad than in Latvia.




"Small, you say?"
